

YOUR DAY AT THE FESTIVAL:

Individual students may compete in up to two of three categories: monologues, duets, group scenes. Students will perform each of their events twice, once in the morning and once in the afternoon. Between the morning and afternoon sessions, a boxed lunch is provided for all participants.

In the morning sessions, the judges offer verbal feedback and performance suggestions to the students, much like in a master class. In the afternoon sessions, the students perform their scenes again for a new panel of judges who will score the performances for awards. While scores are being tabulated, students participate in high energy theatre games. The day concludes with the presentation of awards. All students receive recognition for participation.

Performances in all three categories are conducted under *audition conditions*. If required by scene, small hand props are acceptable but no costumes or sets.

Students may enter up to two of three categories.

Monologues-Maximum 3 minutes. One chair will be provided.

Duets (2 person scenes)-Maximum 5 minutes. Two chairs will be provided.

Group Scenes (3 or 4 persons)-Maximum 5 minutes. Four chairs will be provided.
